Councillor Lloyd's Column

Spring is here and we're ready for it! My first glimpse of spring this year was when I saw a tiny constituent in little pink shoes skipping down the road in the sun without her coat on; her long black mane bouncing from side to side. A joyous sight! I thought of how precious our youth are. We are fortunate to live in a town where kids are relatively safe from harm and I hope we as citizens drive slowly and safely through our town to keep it that way. I say that because this is the time of year we see youngsters tearing out of our many sloped driveways on bikes and roller blades - seemingly out of control. You new residents will appreciate the novelty of living in a town built on a hill!

I would also like to acknowledge the sad passing of Louis Klein Beekman Sr. who left us after years of being a generous and cheery handyman and neighbour. Again, for those who are new to town, and you are many, I just ask you to imagine that friendly and helpful guy you met and were deeply impressed with in the town that you came from. That's who Louis was to Port Alice! His smile, chuckle and generosity will be remembered. Our deepest condolences are forwarded to his family.

We have added a management position at this time which will fully complement the growing needs of our village. When our town entered difficult times a few years back our village clerk at the time generously "took the hit" for us and moved to a position in the Peace River Regional District, though she loved it here. This allowed our long - serving treasurer to become clerk and she has done a wonderful and difficult job for us these past few years. As everyone knows, her hours were extremely long and the work load was massive. We thank our CAO for her dedicated service and now give her some help dealing with the ever-growing demands of government. On behalf of all citizens, we give our deep thanks to Gail Lind.

The next item is a sad statement. Who in our midst would do such a thing as destroy our wonderful new sign that graced our waterfront at the boat launch? This interesting historical sign was vandalized by axe and chainsaw in the night by someone who needs help! If you know this person please consider the \$500 reward for information leading to his or her arrest. Far more importantly, encourage them to see the counselor that comes to our clinic each Friday so that they can relieve their stress in a more positive manner. The citizens of this village should not have to lose \$thousands due to someone's sad distress and bitterness. Like the daycare teachers say to the children "What you did was a bad, bad thing!"

Many will be wondering about the removal of our long-serving playground equipment which the Lions Club and others helped to provide for our park many years ago. In fact, the wooden structure was at the end of it's life span and our good ol steel helicopter was not a CSA approved piece of playground equipment, which is absolutely necessary for liability purposes in this age of litigation and lawyers. Our insurance Czar deemed it disposable and no one can stand against such responsibility to be sure. Thus, we are embarking on a playground replacement program soon, which the Lions indicate they will most likely help with. Other groups and individuals interested in helping with such a fund-raising effort should make themselves known to the village clerk as well. I

believe the community's children will benefit from the generosity of many in the near future. Council would also like to congratulate Doug Bondue for being honored for the hockey volunteer awards. Thank you Doug, for your diligence.

Finally, I would like to thank Jim Gordon and Neucel for his fine work sharpening the Zamboni blades for our ice rink. The village saved a few \$thousand or so from their generosity in letting the blades be sharpened here as opposed to shipping them to Nanaimo. Every penny counts and this is certainly appreciated. That's all for now...

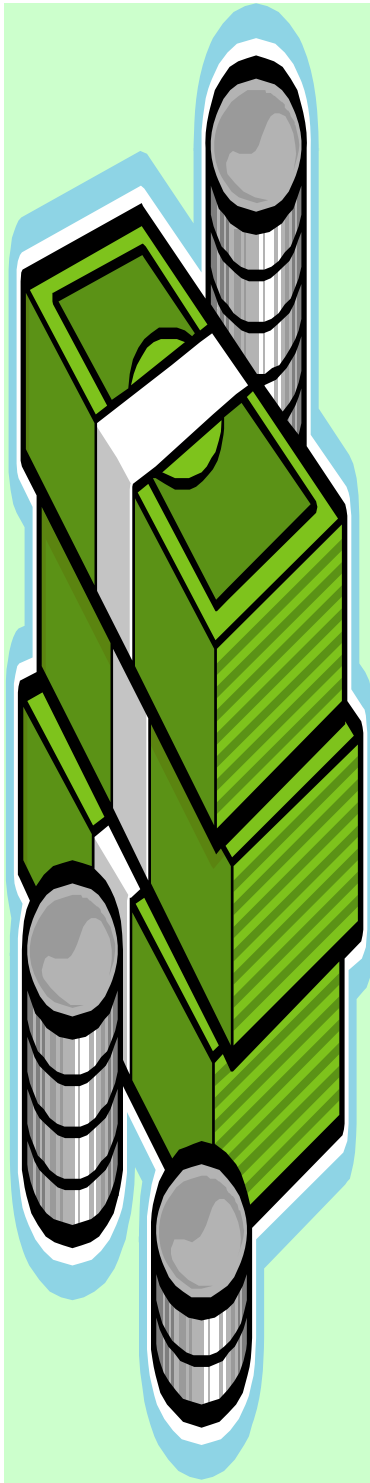
