Village of Port Alice Garbage Collection

Residential Garbage Collection

Collection is once per week, either Monday or Thursday depending on where you live. Your garbage should be placed in a regulation garbage receptacle (3.5 cubic feet with a good fitting, water-tight cover, that birds and animals cannot get into.) Plastic bags can be placed inside a proper receptacle but **MUST NOT** be left on the boulevard unless it is placed inside a proper receptacle.

The following materials will not be collected by the garbage collector and must be taken to the transfer station or directly to 7 mile Recycling

Hazardous waste	Contaminated Soil
Cardboard	Scrap Metal
Carcasses	Construction waste
Batteries	Tires
Appliances	Flammable waste

Recycle/Transfer Station/Burn Pile

If you miss the garbage pick-up, or wish to empty your containers between pick-up days, the Transfer Station is available to all Port Alice Residents, free of charge, 24 hours per day. Make sure to sort your waste and put it in the designated areas. The big blue bin is **not** intended for food waste. Household garbage (including food waste) should be placed in the bins inside the concrete food waste building. **This site is NOT for commercial use and NOT for large quantities of rubbish.**

The Recycle Building is also located on the same site, there are bins for the items that can be recycled. Please make sure to follow all directions and instructions. Recycling is important to all of us, so please do whatever you can to reduce, reuse and recycle.

The Burn Pile located at Dawson Landing (down the roadway by the Welcome to Port Alice sign) is for wood **ONLY**. Do not place anything but wood there for burning and do not light it on fire.

Yard Debris

There is a site behind the Angus Dawson Ball Field designated for yard debris. The debris must only contain debris that composts - no plant containers, bags etc. Do not place debris in bags or other containers.

REMINDER TO OUTSIDE BIN USERS.....FLATTENED
CARDBOARD ONLY

That means NO packing materials such as styrofoam and plastic bags. Please discard in garbage, don't leave on the ground for others to pick up!

BOXBOARD no longer goes in cardboard bin. Please bring to inside depot with your other paper recycling.

Only #2 plastics and milk jugs are accepted on the North Island. In consideration of others please rinse plastics, milk jugs and tin cans out.

GLASS is not recycled on the North Island

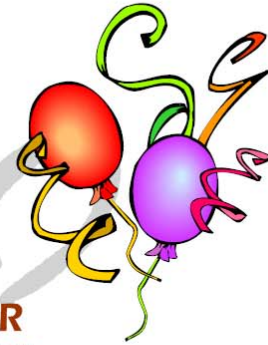
Battery Recycling:

- The Depot is now accepting **both Alkaline and Rechargeable Batteries** for recycling.
- Rechargeable batteries eligible for collection and recycling are: Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Lithium Ion (Li-ion), Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH) and Small Sealed Lead (Pb).
- Small dry cell portable rechargeable batteries are commonly found in cordless power tools, cellular and cordless phones, laptop computers, camcorders, two-way radios and remote control toys.
